Superintendent's Message

Like many, I look forward to the Vancouver Train Expo (VTEx) every year. The Lower Mainland Train Expo Society (LMTES), the legal entity that underlies the VTEx, puts on this event.

Tom Lundgren, the President of the LMTES and Team Leader, has retired after almost 10 years at the helm. Under his guidance, the VTEx has grown considerably since the 2015 move from the smaller venue at Cameron Centre. The 44,000 square foot space at the PNE Forum has been full, with waiting lists since the 2017 event. Attendance reached 6,400 for the 2019 show, and following the pandemic closures in 2020-2022, it again reached 6,400 for the 2024 show. Tom has done a magnificent job, leaving a strong and capable management team in place, along with solid finances.

The PNE Forum is tentatively booked for November 7-9, 2025. Funding is in place, and a solid organizing committee is ready to start work on VTEx 2025. Operations Manager Brian Dobbin, Registrar Howard Sommerfield, and Business Manager Don Thicke continue their current roles. However, they cannot do so without a new President and Team Leader.

In order for VTEx 2025 to go ahead, the following positions must be filled:

- President of the LMTES: This position has traditionally been assumed by the VTEx Leader, but that is optional.
- Team Leader/Manager: Project management, leadership, finance, risk (liability), legal and promotion skills.

In addition, when/if the PNE informs the LMTES of another party wanting the dates, the LMTES will have a few days to confirm and pay the deposit. The LMTES should also confirm and pay the deposit by the end of April. Without a Team Leader, this cannot be done, and there will be no VTEx 2025.

The LMTES also needs a few more members to join the team, bring their talents and energy, and share in the challenges, rewards, and camaraderie of putting on this event.

- Promotion Coordinator: promotions across various media, radio, print, and social media.
- Volunteer Coordinator

- Creative Manager
- Communications / Social Media Coordinator
- Children's Activity Coordinator
- Assistant Operations Manager: Floor planning and managing event contractors
- Assistant Registrar

These support people can only be filled after appointing a new president and team leader.

Over the past several years, the 7th Division has provided financial support and limited content (Craftsman Corner) and publicity for the event. The LMTES is again faced with a difficult decision. I am requesting your assistance to help LMTES fill out these crucial positions. Knowledge of railway modelling, while an asset, is not required. Perhaps a friend, relative, or business associate would be interested in helping and, if not already, possibly becoming a railway modeller as well.

The 7th Division's Annual General Meeting (AGM) is scheduled for March 10th, 2025. The 2024 AGM Minutes, 2024 Treasurer Report, and 2024 Secretary's Report are available on the Division's website: https://7divpnr.ca on the Documents page. More reports will be on the site as they become available.

Lastly, for those unaware, Ken Martin passed away on January 3rd, 2025. While I did not know Ken well, he usually said "Hi" and talked briefly while attending train shows and operation sessions. He is missed.

The minutes of the 2024 AGM are included below.

7th Division, Pacific Northwest Region, NMRA Canada 2024 AGM Minutes

Quorum attendance was achieved by the beginning of the meeting at 7 p.m.

Agenda presented and approved - Moved by Lori Sebelley, 2nded by Tim Horton

2023 November AGM minutes read and approved - Moved by Lori Sebelley, 2nded by Tim Horton

Treasurer's Report read by Larry Sebelley and received – Motion to receive report by T. Horton, 2nded by J. Little

Unfinished business – Ferrier collection is still being catalogued by Revelstoke Railway Museum; last report was that it is close to being done. Some changes to the original plan have occurred consisting mainly of the document scanning being done locally in Revelstoke, and then comparison of those documents with CPHA (Canadian Pacific Historical Association) to avoid duplicate copies being posted publicly at a future date.

Elections were conducted for positions of Secretary, Treasurer, and Director-at-Large. As there were no nomination from the floor all positions were filled by acclamation: Randy Nussli for Secretary, Larry Sebelley for Treasurer, Ken Rutherford for Director-at-Large.

New Business:

Discussion ensued about 7th Division starting a Facebook page titled Model Railway BC. Requests were put forward for a Social Media Director volunteer who would be willing to administer the Facebook page. All 7th Division members were invited to submit photos and other posts concerning their own model railroading developments and other hobby-related posts. No volunteers were willing to step forward to fill this post during the meeting. The request for a volunteer was left open for anyone wanting to take on this post.

Surrey Excursion 2024 Report (NMRA Regional Convention) was given by Lori Sebelley. In general things are coming together nicely for this 7th Division-hosted event in May:- attendance is filling up nicely and the event will more than likely have enough participants to cover most event costs. The different programs being offered throughout the weekend included 46 clinics, a bus tour of the G3 Grain Handling Terminal in North Vancouver (almost full), a number of model railroad layout tours were being scheduled throughout the weekend, several layout operating sessions were also scheduled for the weekend (almost full), a Modelling with the Masters workshop was scheduled the first day of the convention (full), a modelling contest and display room including A.P. judging was organized throughout the duration of the convention weekend, activities for non-modellers were scheduled, and of course the banquet was scheduled for Saturday evening.

Business was concluded and motion to adjourn was made and approved – Moved by T. Horton, 2nded by L Sebelley

7th Division Modelling Nights

As your current Assistant Superintendent, I have been involved in discussions at the board level on how to increase the value of membership in our 7th Division. One measure I have implemented is the hosting of monthly modelling nights in the Lower Mainland. There is an opportunity for other members to host similar evenings in their areas, so I thought I would share some of the requirements for hosting such an evening, and some of our recent experiences.

We began hosting our modelling nights on the North Shore in December 2021. Initially they were held in a member's home, using tables set up in the aisle of his layout room. This space was limited to three or four people, and these early sessions were essentially proof of concept opportunities. On at least one occasion we even had a member join us virtually. In 2024 we relocated to a larger room in my strata complex to be able to host more people, and we opened these events to the members at large. Attendance has increased steadily since then and continues to grow.

The Concept

The idea behind these events is simple. Members are encouraged to bring a project to work on for a few hours. It can be a locomotive, rolling stock or structure model, an electronics project, basically anything which is reasonably portable. Attendees are asked to bring their own hobby mat to work on, and whatever tools and supplies they might need.

The intent was to foster community and fellowship among our members through shared modelling time, conversation and dialogue. We learned quickly that attendees enjoyed seeing what others were working on, asking and answering questions about each others'

work, and engaging in conversation on current modelling and railroading topics.

We also learned that during these evenings, those who attended were able to make significant progress on their projects, and often went home with a sense of accomplishment and satisfaction for an evening well spent.

Unfortunately, not everyone in our division is able to attend these sessions held on the North Shore, and it would be great to see similar events hosted in other areas for the benefit of members there. This would be especially true for areas outside the Lower Mainland where members might have fewer opportunities to engage with fellow modellers. Let's have a look at what is required to host such an event.

Scheduling

We have learned that scheduling these events on a regular basis (e.g. same day of the month) helps to foster attendance as members are able to anticipate when the next session will be. We have chosen the first Friday of each month and have found that a Friday night modelling event is something people can look forward to throughout the week.

I typically schedule our evenings from 7:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M., but we are finding that most attendees are enjoying themselves so much that we have been finishing nearer to 10:00 P.M. of late, and some often stay for tea and coffee afterwards.

Promotion

It is important to get the word out about the event to foster attendance. Our board can assist with this by sending out an email to members in advance of your own event. You should notify our Superintendent (superintendent@7divpnr.ca) if you are planning to host such an event, and you can send an email promoting it to our Superintendent and Secretary (secretary@7divpnr.ca) who can forward it to members.

When announcing such an event, you will want to remind members to bring a project, a hobby mat, and the tools and supplies they will need, as well as when and where to arrive. Depending on the location you may also wish to provide directions, transit information, and parking instructions. I do ask members to RSVP so I know how many are coming,

and I send out directions to new attendees the night before.

Facility

The size of the room you require will depend on how many attendees you expect. Some members might be able to host a modelling night in their home as we did initially, but this might limit you to a small number of people. There are several options to explore for sourcing larger rooms. These include strata complex meeting rooms, church meeting rooms, school classrooms, or community centre rooms in your area. If a rental fee is required, you may be able to defray this with a small collection from attendees each month.

In addition to having sufficient space for the number of people expected to attend, another key requirement for the space is sufficient lighting. People will have difficulty working on projects if the room is poorly lit, and most won't want to have to bring lamps and power cords with them. Speaking of power, it is advantageous to have a few power outlets available for those who might need it.

Furnishings

To host a modelling night, you will require tables and chairs. If you can source a meeting room at a strata complex, church, school, or community centre, these will typically be available there. The meeting room we are

using has the usual plastic folding tables which can accommodate two modellers side by side. These are quick to set up and take down and are easily cleaned after use.

On the topic of cleanliness, I ask attendees to bring a hobby mat to work on to avoid damage to tables, and I ask them not to engage in any spraying work. I also ask them to assist in ensuring that the tables are clean at the end of the evening.

Virtual Attendance

If you live in an area where members are too far apart to attend in person, why not consider a virtual modelling night? We found that it is possible for members to attend virtually using a video conferencing app such as FaceTime, Skype, Google Meet, or Zoom. Hicks and Rene Gourley work side by side on their projects.

It is possible for a member to work at their own workbench and still enjoy the benefits of collaboration and conversation that these evenings provide.

Conclusion

The feedback I have received after hosting these events has been very positive. Attendees enjoy the opportunity to converse and discuss, learn from others, and make progress on their projects. So, if you are looking for a similar opportunity in your area, or are willing to try and host one, why not give it a try? Obituary

Ken Martin

Ken was born June 6, 1942 in Bella Bella, BC, where his father was running the cannery store. Raised in Vancouver, Ken graduated from David Thompson High School in 1960. At UBC, he earned a BA in Geography in 1964, followed by a BEd.

He worked for a number of firms in the trucking industry. He taught dangerous goods handling and filled positions from dispatch to international compliance. Early in his career, Ken was introduced to the Canadian Institute of Traffic and Transportation (CITT), an organization dedicated to raising professional standards in the transportation industry. He served as Chairman and remained active in CITT until his death.

Ken was a kind and generous man who took organizational memberships seriously, whether church, professional, or recreational. During high school, he took part in Older Boys' Parliament; an organization in which he remained interested after he aged out, and served as a member of the Board of what became B.C. Youth Parliament.

Ken was actively involved in the United Church from the age of 15. He served on church boards and on regional committees, as well as being a member and President of the local church men's club.

Ken loved railways. If there was a railway museum or display anywhere, he made sure to visit. He attended railfan events, was involved with several groups of modellers, and many times helped in the planning of a local annual convention. Ken served as Treasurer of the later Trains shows and then of the Vancouver Train Exposition shows from 2013 up until last fall when he had to resign due to failing health.

Ken was especially interested in rail transit. He had a collection of street car models and was very knowledgeable about BC Electric Railway and BC Hydro history and operations. Although he never got his own layout built, Ken put a lot of effort into supporting the construction and operation of other people's layouts. He was a regular member of the operations crews at several layouts.

Ken died January 3, 2025. He is survived by Helen, his wife of 60 years, and his son Ian.
