Vancouver Train Expo Update

My report in the January/February 7th Division Bulletin Board on Vancouver Train Expo 2024 provided details on the event and a history during my involvement. The report ended with a comments on the future of the event, most importantly the urgent need to rebuild the organizing committee.

As reported, last year's event was very successful. The show is in excellent financial shape, with sufficient funds to finance the event without, for the first time, the need to borrow money. The legal entity, Lower Mainland Train Expo Society, is in good standing and available to continue the event. The Treasurer, Operations Manager, and Registrar are willing to continue in their roles.

Regrettably, no progress has been made in rejuvenating the committee, nor has a new leader emerged. Time is rapidly running out to organize Vancouver Train Expo 2025. Normally, the organizing committee would be preparing to sign a contract to rent the PNE Forum and open registration sometime in May. None of this work has been done. The PNE has approached us inquiring about our intentions as other parties have expressed interest in the dates (November 7, 8, 9). Unless this situation is remedied very soon, it will be too late to organize the event.

In short, this is the last call for Vancouver Train Expo 2025. Failing significant progress on rebuilding the committee by the middle of May, it will be necessary to release our "hold dates" on the PNE Forum and cancel the show.

My Visit to the Kato Hobby Store in Central Tokyo

My wife and I recently went to Japan to ski and we had four days in Tokyo on our return. In her internet trip planning, my wife searched out (on the internet) the headquarters for Kato and their largest store with the crafty plan of sending me off to Kato while she toured the stores of Ginza.

My visit(s) to the store made for a fun day. It is a large two-story store to the west of central Tokyo, about 45 minutes by subway from Ginza, including all walk time. Very modern and well laid out, it has several large layouts. The largest on the main floor (see picture below) is a normal "hands-off" display of several automatically running trains.

On the upper level there is a large layout organized as ten operating positions each with control of a



(see some examples in my pictures). I am not familiar with Kato pricing in Canada, but these prices seemed very reasonable. If I had a N-scale layout, I would definitely have purchased one of the Shinkansen train sets – they have models of each series/type.

In the store the emphasis was definitely on DC. Factory DCC equipped trains were less in evidence and DCC sound very much the exception.

For obvious reasons, there was a very limited number of North American trains, although they did have an excellent selection of Amtrak passenger consists of various generations. Again, if I had an N-scale layout I would have been very tempted.



separate, independent loop. Here you can book time on your chosen route and run the trains that you may have just purchased or have brought from home. As you can see from the pictures, there was a continuous set of young modellers and their parents running trains. The emphasis seemed to be on passenger trains, usually one of the main high speed Japanese Shinkansen consists. It was fun to watch the keen attention of the youngsters. Invariably Mum or Dad was equally interested.

The store was comfortably busy – not crowded but enough people to give a nice Japanese energy to the space.

The N-scale focus of Kato was in evidence here, with case after case of N-scale trains to purchase





I don't know how Kato sells N-scale here, but in Japan they sell them in very convenient carry cases that look like A4 sized books. I noted that this (a) made it easy to carry and store complete trains, and (b) must encourage modellers to buy more train consists as they are so compact. You could have a huge roster of trains on a 6-foot bookshelf. It would have been interesting to know how many of the youngsters I saw running trains bring them to the story to run on a large layout because they don't have such space at home, and how many were testing trains they had just bought. The store is open to 8pm every evening except Sunday when it remains open until 7pm.

In any case, my conclusion was that in spite of limited space at home, model railroading is thriving


in Japan (Kato's financial reports seem to back up this impression).

In conclusion, attentive readers may have noticed that I said "visits(s)" above. Yes, I did go back. When I was in the store the first time, I purchased some HO Kato Unitrack for a testing set up I am planning. After getting back to the hotel room and showing off my track to my wife (I could see the disappointment in her eyes), I realized that I HAD TO GO BACK and purchase one of the beautiful Japanese locomotives that would have no place at all on my layout.

Check out the last picture below. How could I resist the three trucks and all that detail in the pantographs? The EF81 is a 2009 vintage locomotive used on so-called European-style passenger trains – the Super Express Rainbow – the "Hokutosei", "Elm", "Cassiopeia" and the "Akebono". It has the smoothest Kato drive I have ever (not) heard and I am sure it will be a super-challenge to upgrade to DCC (the fellow in the store explained that it is designed to have a separate decoder on each truck) but this is what our hobby is all about. I can't wait to see it pulling a long string of inter-modal container cars.
