Superintendent's Message

Moscrop Secondary School in Burnaby has for the last few years had an art class that focused on model railways, and has created a model railway club that meets one day a week after school hours. The club participated in the Vancouver Train Expo shows in 2023 and 2024. The class was one block and had about 30 students. The teacher and driving force behind this class is Aidan Botting, a member of the 7th Division since 2024. Aidan presented a clinic on making reflective signs at the Surrey Express Convention in 2024 and many of his students participated in the tabletop session as well, showing off 3D printing, scale fence making and how to make figures. Below is a summary of the class.

Model Railway Building and Design

This is a specialized Honours-level course that is currently categorized under the umbrella of Art Studio 3D. Students in this course are required to learn about and demonstrate a modicum of applied skills and should, therefore, be self-motivated, passionate about the subject, and desire being challenged. Such skills include architecture, electronics, landscaping, structural engineering, painting, and sculpture to name only a few. However, the central theme is the laying and wiring of track as well as programming and operating prototypical scale models of locomotives. Model railway equipment is expensive. Therefore, the passing of a small exam is required as a sort of contract between the teacher and student to be allowed to operate. The Model Railway Building and Design course has helped a few students get into post-secondary programs like Architecture and Environmental Sustainability. As there are many aspects involved with building and operating a model railway layout, to be successful in the program, students must be passionate about the subject and come to class prepared to work hard and focus on what is being taught every single day. They must also be prepared to collaborate and share what they learn with others (reciprocal learning). Whatever the project, the goal must be to make representations that are to scale and demonstrate accuracy with a high level of realism as reflected in the real world.

For the 2025-2026 school year the class has been expanded to two blocks and will have about 60 students. After Vancouver Train Expo events and visiting a Free-Mo event in our area, Aidan has decided this year to have the students to work in pairs on a 24" x 16" module built to a Moscrop standard like other module standards. The 7th Division has made a small financial contribution to assist in building the carcasses for the modules and is will be supporting Aidan, the club and Moscrop school going forward.

The next train show in the division will be the annual Victoria Model Railway Show, September 21, 2025. After that there will be the Chilliwack Train and Hobby Show, October 18 & 19, 2025. As mentioned in April, the Lower Mainland Train Expo Society (LMTES), the legal entity that underlies the Vancouver Train Expo (VTEEx) every year, is having trouble finding a president and show coordinator. Because of these problems, the VTEEx show will not happen in 2025. Unless a society president and show coordinator is found, it is unlikely the show will return.

It is with a heavy heart that I let the membership know of the passing of two of our members: Jim Brown and Gary Hazell. Both were long-time members of the 7th Division and will be missed. Obituaries for both are provided on page 12. The 7th Division extends its sincere condolences to Jim's and Gary's families.

As always, whether you are just starting or have been modelling for years, welcome. Feel free to contact me or any on the 7th Division Board with questions or suggestions.

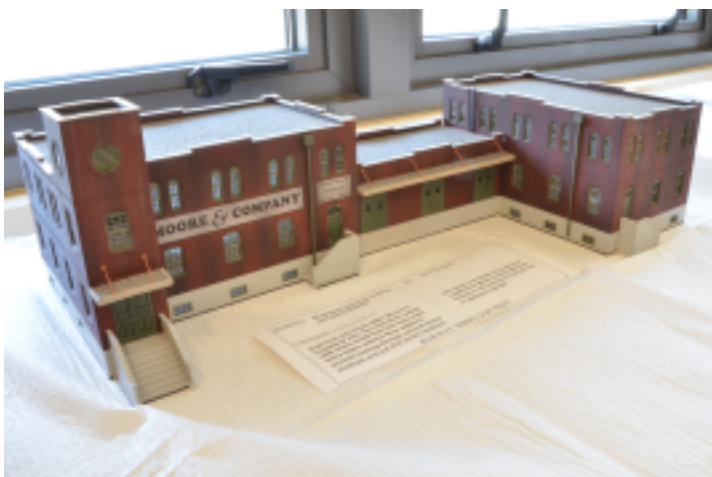

2025 Railway Heritage Award

The Railway Heritage Award is presented annually, when appropriate, to a current member of the 7th Division who has contributed in a meaningful way to the preservation of railway history. To be considered for the award, the nominee shall have performed one or more of the following:

- have been a member of an historical association or society that works on the preservation and presentation of railway history and artifacts
- have contributed to the preservation of railway history through published writings or through volunteer work on restoration projects
- have exhibited a substantial interest in the history of railways in British Columbia and its preservation; or contributed many hours volunteering with an operating heritage railway
- have participated substantially in some other significant way to preserve railway heritage

A candidate for this award is nominated by his or her peers, and the chosen recipient must be recommended by the award co-ordinator and approved by the 7th Division Board of Directors.

I was pleased to present this year's award to Timothy Horton at the 2025 Railway Modellers' Meet of BC.

Timothy is a prototype modeller who enjoys sharing the story of his prototype, the British Columbia Railway and its predecessor the Pacific Great Eastern railway. He was one of the early members of the short-lived BC Rail Historical & Technical Society, and co-chair of the committees that organized three conventions related to the railway including the PGE 100th anniversary convention held in Squamish in 2012.

His research has led to his publishing seven books on the history of the railway. He is always ready to share his interest in the railway by presenting clinics at meets and has shared modelling information in fourteen articles published in the model railway press. He is a member of a group of BC Rail modellers that presents their models and share their knowledge of the railway at most local model railway shows. He has a blog on his model railway (<https://bcdawsonsub.ca/>) where he shares the railway's history and includes modelling tips on creating detailed prototypical models.

Gary was born November 27, 1942, in Vancouver, BC. He attended Vancouver Technical School and later BCIT, launching a successful career in electronic equipment sales.

In April 1966, Gary married Donna in Vancouver. Together, they made their home in Port Coquitlam, where Gary and Donna's love of entertaining made their house a favourite gathering spot. In the early 1980s, Gary and Donna moved to the Shuswap, purchasing a home on Shuswap Lake. Gary and Donna did not have children, but shared their home with several cherished cocker spaniels over the years.

After retiring, Gary and Donna moved into Salmon Arm. They enjoyed wintering in the southern US, embarked on an epic trip to Africa, and spent many happy hours on road trips in their Miata.

Gary dedicated himself to extensive community service. A long-time member of the the Salmon Arm Rotary Club, Gary was recognized for his outstanding contributions to his community and was awarded the prestigious Paul Harris Fellowship for his distinguished service as a Rotarian.

Gary was also a long-time member of the Salmon Arm Model Railway Club, as well as of the 7th Division where he served as Division Superintendent for many years. Among other things, he attended numerous model railway meets, wrote for the Bulletin Board, and was involved in working on the 2016 Selkirk Express PNR convention held in Tacoma.

Gary died on June 22, 2025. He is survived by his wife Donna, and many relatives and friends.
