

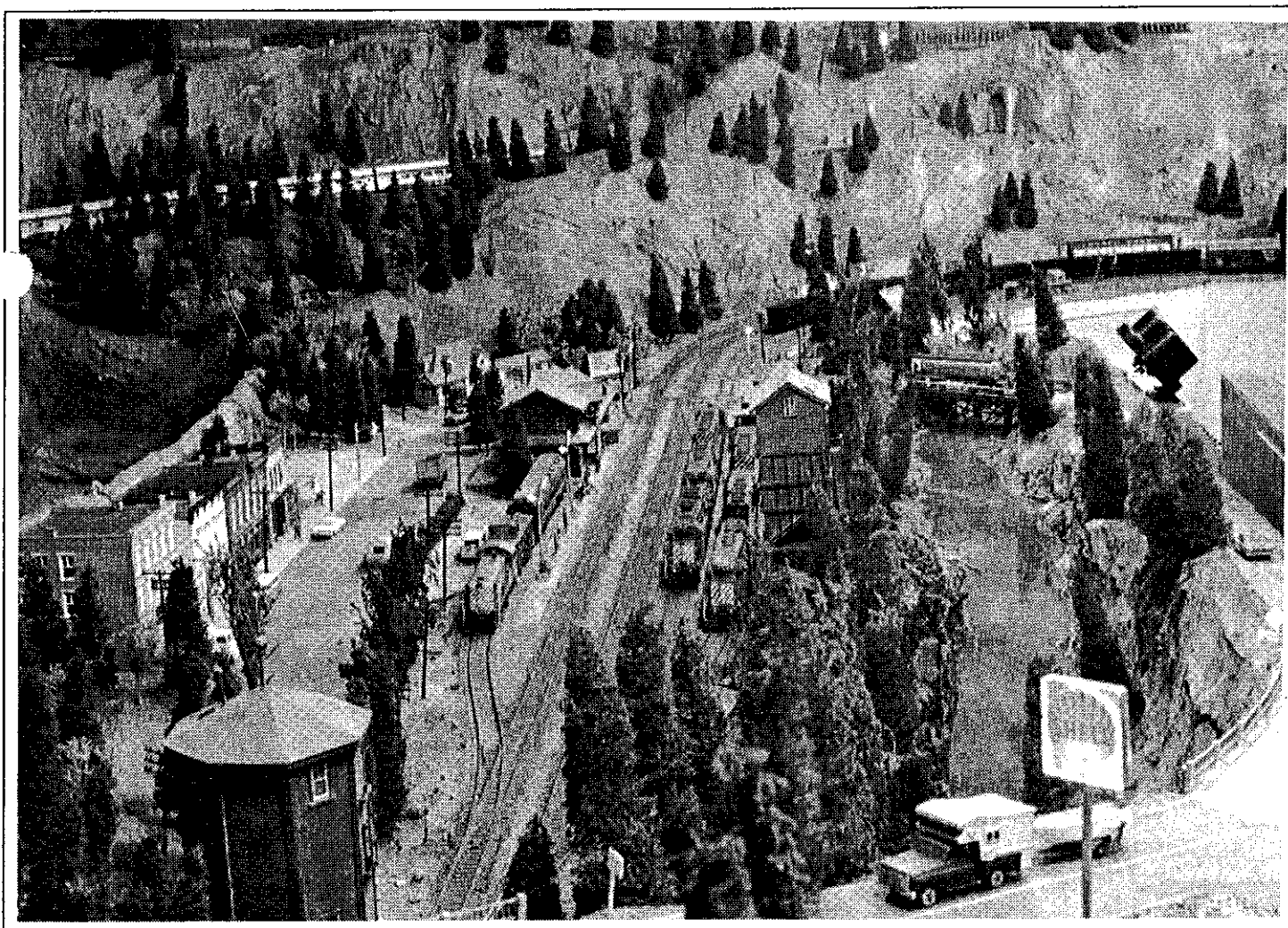

Sunday, April 5th was our eighth annual Mid Vancouver Island Spring Meet. This event was held in the Country Club Mall in Naniamo, B.C. We had over 557 tickets sold which was down slightly from last year's record of 625 tickets. Participants were as far away as Halifax, Nova Scotia, Calgary, Alberta and several points in Washington State. Those attending had lots of model railroading to see.

Thanks go out to the Upper Island-Campbell River group for bringing their 3.7 by 12.2 metre modules, and the Victoria N-Track Group with their 3.7 by 4.9 meter layout. New to our show was the Sidney Model Railway Club with their 3.7 by 7.3 metre HO scale modules. One the Sidney MRC modules is based on the *Port of Los Angeles Project Railroad* that appeared in the Dec. 90 to March 91 issues of *Model Railroader* magazine.

There were also several live steam models on display by modelers from Courtenay.

Workshop Notes

Electronics will be the focus of the June Workshop. Phil Jones, a high school teacher, model railroader and a new face will lead a participation workshop on the theory and fabrication of a LED crossing signal using the 556 dual timer.

Phil will begin by explaining a little digital theory using what he calls the black box approach. That means he is not interested what's inside the device, just what it does. Several other uses of the circuit will be suggested including more advanced uses to achieve spectacular effects. Finally, time permitting, Phil will explain how to trigger the circuit with various electronic detection systems.

The electronic components required will be supplied for a small fee. You will need to bring a small soldering iron (not gun), pliers with cutters, a work board, visual aid (if required) and a lamp.

After the summer break we will again offer a variety of workshops for the modeler. Possible future topics include the custom fabrication of turnouts using a variety of techniques; painting figures; decalling and lettering; building structures; weathering with various materials and several others. If anyone reading this has any other suggestions, ideas or possible contributions please give me a call, drop me a note or collar me at one of the workshops and bend my ear. By the way I'm also looking for someone to take on the workshop coordinators job sometime in the fall.

Ken Davis Remembered

On May 12, 1992, Ken Davis completed his last run.

Throughout his many years in model railroading, Ken was a tireless promoter of the hobby, sharing both his knowledge and his enthusiasm with veteran modelers and neophytes alike. He encouraged new modelers to join the PNR and NMRA. He opened his layout to visitors at almost any hour of the day or night. Many local modelers recall visits to Ken's layout as the starting point of their involvement in model railroading.

Ken has been actively involved in the Nor-West club from its early days. But his participation was not limited to adult modelers. He shared his enthusiasm with younger modelers as well. In the early sixties there was a teenage club that met on Friday evenings. A highlight of their meetings occurred every few months, when they would be invited to Ken Davis' or Frank McKinney's layout.

Ken was a member of the organizing committee for the very successful NMRA *Totemland* national convention held in Vancouver in 1965. This convention attracted a record 933 registrants, a record which stood for many years. The visits to the North Shore layouts are still remembered by many who attended that convention. During the banquet at this convention, Ken was awarded the PNR *Man of the Year* award.

Ken served on the PNR executive as the 7th Division superintendent, and for at least twenty years as a member of the 7th Division

Standing Committee. His outstanding contribution to the 7th Division and his service to the hobby was recognized with a long overdue *Ross Heriot Gold Spike Award* at Trains 91.

In Addition to his organizational efforts, Ken completed his home layout. The *Great Northland Railway* was constructed in the late fifties and early sixties. In constructing his layout, Ken pioneered many new techniques

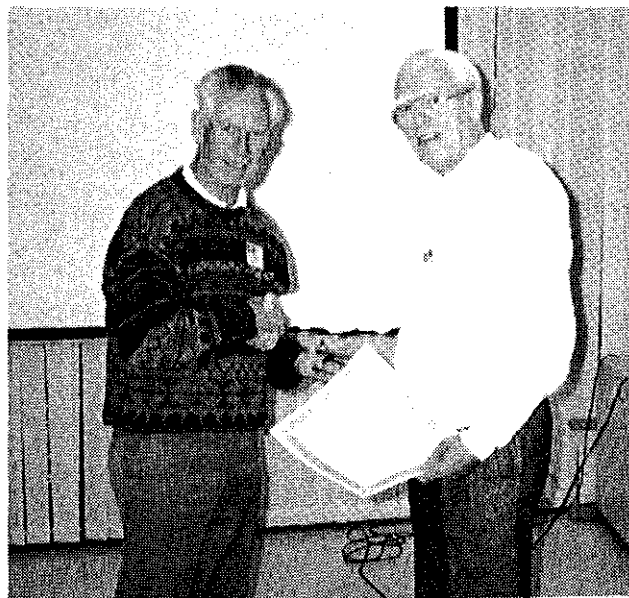
including using the then-new code 70 rail hand-spiked to individual wooden ties. He also employed many innovative scenery techniques. His layout was featured in the September 1989 issues of *Model Railroader* magazine where it compared favourably with more recently constructed pikes. The article was a tribute to the excellence of his craftsmanship.

Professionally, Ken was involved in the dental supply business. Not surprisingly, he found a way to adapt dental

products to model railroading. He pioneered techniques of duplicating model components using dental acrylics.

Ken will be remembered for the many clinics he gave, particularly the ones on scenery and backdrop painting. Ken frequently shared his expertise with others, and several layouts on the North Shore and further afield feature backdrops produced by his talented hand and brush. Once his layout was completed, Ken continued to develop his painting skill and techniques - a hobby he shared with his wife Dorothy.

To Dorothy, and to their children and grandchildren, we offer our condolences; gems like Ken are too few and far between.



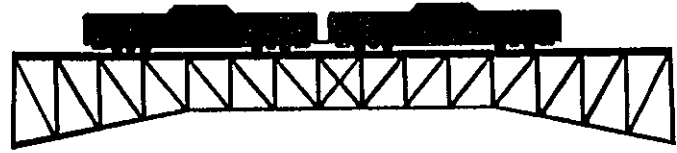
Ken, (right) received the Ross Heriot Gold Spike Award from Hank Menkveld at the Trains 91 banquet.

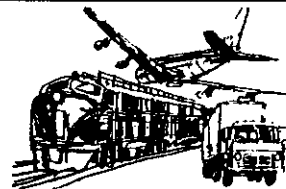
