PNR 2024 Regional Convention Hosted by the 7th Division

This convention will take place May 22-26, 2024, and be held at the Sheraton Guildford Hotel in Surrey, BC. The convention will be called Surrey Excursion. Note that it will replace next year's RMMBC.

The Sheraton Guildford is in a central location in the BC Lower Mainland and is conveniently located close to Highway 1 (Trans-Canada) with easy access on and off. There is public transit, many restaurants, and the second largest shopping mall in BC across the street from the hotel. For our visitors arriving from the South, there are at least two direct border crossings, Pacific Highway and Aldergrove. Using either of these will eliminate having to use Peace Arch border crossing, which tends to have the most traffic.

Our blocked preferred hotel guest room rate will be \$165.00 plus taxes per night. There is a grace period of three days either side of the convention dates to receive the preferred rate for anyone wishing to do some exploring. For those guests staying overnight in the hotel, we have negotiated complimentary parking and Wi-Fi for an additional saving of \$25.00 per day. A daily parking fee will be charged for those not staying in the hotel.

All clinic, display/contest, banquet, and non-rail rooms will be located on the second floor of the hotel. Access to all event locations will be provided by conveniently located elevators.

The host committee comprises 7th Division members who are experienced with conventions/events and are working hard to make sure everyone has a great time and learns at least something new. We will be offering a social gathering, self-guided layout tours, contests, displays, AP evaluation, clinics, Modelling with the Masters, operation sessions, a non-rail program, a banquet with a keynote speaker, as well as a raffle. We are working on and hope to be able to have escorted prototype tours and a hands-on project as well.

We have determined a three-tier registration fee for full-fare registration rates as follows.

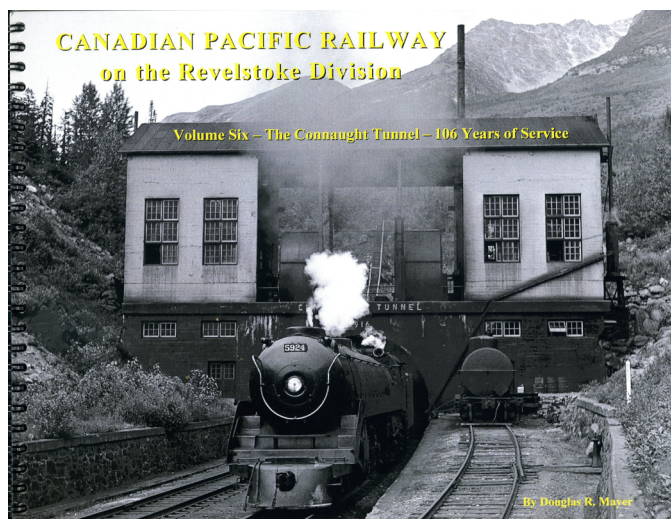
The Modeller's Bookshelf

The Connaught Tunnel's Story Told in Depth

I have read and reviewed earlier volumes in the "Canadian Pacific Railway on the Revelstoke Division" series of books written by 7th Divisioner Douglas Mayer and published by the Revelstoke Railway Museum. "Volume Six – The Connaught Tunnel – 106 Years of Service" is the latest book in the series.

Although the book's pages are the same size as earlier volumes, there are a lot more of them (104 in all) and the book is wire bound instead of being stapled. The format inside is also the same as earlier volumes, with large photos, plans or maps on most pages. Most importantly, the book is entirely focussed on the Connaught Tunnel, the CPR's first tunnel under Roger's Pass, instead of the more broadly based contents of the other volumes.



The book is written in chronological order, starting with problems with the line over Roger's Pass, the tunnel design and construction, tunnel operations during various periods, events (such as floods and fires), and changes made over the years. I particularly found interesting the discussion of the pioneer tunnel construction method, the tunnel ventilation system, the consideration given to electric locomotives, and a discussion of a strange incident when a train stalled in the tunnel without the engine crew knowing and ended up becoming stuck due to depressions it had melted in the rails. I also loved the many photos of the tunnel in operation, detailed information such as the track plans for Glacier, and obscure bits of information such as the operational dates of the covered turntable that used to exist in Glacier.

The book is well written and easy to read, with lots of clearly printed and interesting images. Mr. Mayer's research is extensive, and the coverage detail is impressive. No doubt some readers would find that this book contains a bit more than they want to know about the tunnel, but the depth of information suited me fine.

I strongly recommend this book for anyone modelling the CPR or interested in CPR history, as well as for readers with a fairly detailed interest in more general railway history or operation. It can be purchased for \$35 from the Revelstoke Railway Museum gift shop or their website at www.railwaymuseum.com, and can occasionally be found at other locations.

Addendum

7th Division Club Directory

The clubs are listed first by geographical area (yellow background) and then alphabetically by club name.

Vancouver Island

Vancouver Island Garden Railway Club

Membership: [no information]

Layout: [There is no mention on the website of a club-owned layout]

Club Description: The club has a website <https://vigardenrailwayclub.com/> and a [Facebook page](#). They both contain a lot of pictures and videos of people running garden railway equipment, but little on club events or on the club itself.

Contact: There is a contact form on the website and an [email address](#) for getting information on becoming a member.

Vancouver Island Model Engineers, Central Saanich

Membership: The club is actively recruiting additional members.

Layout: The club has a large outdoor multi-gauge layout located next to Highway 17 between Victoria and Sidney. It is open to the public two or more weekends a month between May and October.

Club Description: The club is dedicated to Model Engineering in all forms. While most club members have an interest in railways this is not true of all, and many members model other items such as boats and various types of engines. The club operates a miniature railway where the public can enjoy rides on published dates and members can get experience in these operations and the pleasure of seeing others having fun. The club has a website at <https://vime.ca/> with a large display of photos and videos.

Contact: There is a contact form on the website.

Lower Mainland

British Columbia Society of Model Engineers, Burnaby

Membership: The club is actively recruiting additional members, with diverse skills welcome. Members should be 14 years or older.

Layout: The club has an outdoor layout (the Burnaby Central Railway) consisting of four kilometres of 7.5 inch gauge track located in a wooded area at the north end of Willingdon Street in Burnaby. There is also a smaller layout of garden-railway track.

Club Description: The club was established in 1929. It uses its layout to provide rides for the general public as well as providing a space for members to run their own locomotives. The club layout is open to the public 11:00 am to 5:00 pm Saturdays, Sundays, and statutory holidays from Easter to Thanksgiving. Members also promote the hobby of model engineering and maintain a railroad-oriented museum. The club's website is at www.bcsme.org.

Canadian Toy Train Association, Burnaby

Membership: The club has over 200 members distributed across Canada but concentrated in the Vancouver area.

Layout: The club has a couple of modular layouts it takes to train shows.

Club Description: The club is focussed on collectible O gauge, S gauge and Standard gauge model trains. The club has nine meetings a year at a community centre in Burnaby, as well as numerous events during the year. It has a website at: www.canadiantoytrains.org and publishes a monthly newsletter called "Canadian Flyer" that is available on the website.

Contact: There is a contact form on the website.

There is also a Vancouver area club called the Top Link Model Railway Association that is focused on British railway models. It has displayed layouts in many lower mainland train shows and currently has a display at the BC Society of Model Engineers scheduled for June 11-12, 2023, so it is active. However, I have not received any information on this club, nor been able to find a contact, nor locate an online presence.

Okanagan

Kettle Valley Model Railway Club, Penticton

Membership: The club currently has 12 members. New members are always welcome, and there are no restrictions on who may join.

Layout: The club's layout is located inside the S.S. Sicamous paddlewheeler on the shore of Okanagan Lake in Penticton, BC. The ship is open to the public from May to October, 7 days a week, with a \$10 admission charge. The layout represents the Kettle Valley Railway in 1958. It is in HO scale with 200 metres of track on the upper mainline and 150 metres of track on the lower mainline.

Club Description: The club is a part of the S.S. Sicamous Marine Heritage Society. The club's website is at www.kvmrc.com, and the related SS Sicamous website is at www.sssicamous.ca. They contain extensive information on the CPR and the KVR, as well as photos and videos of the layout.

Golden City Railway Modellers, Trail

Membership: There are currently 19 members in the club. The club is open to new members.

Layout: The club's layout is located at Waneta Plaza Mall between Trail and Fruitvale. The layout is open for public viewing every Saturday between 10:00 am and 3:30 pm. The layout is transportable and has been taken to several shows.

Club Description: The club's layout is a modular railway model of Rossland that depicts the numerous mines, railways and buildings over a time period from the late 1890's to the mid 1950's. Each module focuses on a different time and part of Rossland, so the viewer gets a good sense of the history of the railways, mines and City of Rossland. The club has recently completed an upgrade to the layout to support future expansion and conversion to Free-Mo standards. The planned expansion will support modelling Trail, Castlegar, and Nelson, as well as improving operations.
