Vancouver Train Expo Update

Vancouver Train Expo 2023 will occur at the Forum at the Pacific National Exhibition on Saturday November 4th from 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM and on Sunday November 5th from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM. Setup will be on Friday November 3rd.

Advance preparations are well in hand with the venue, furnishings supplier, and electrical contractor all lined up. Registrations opened early in June. So far, we are ahead of previous year's registrations, including some new vendors and exhibitors. Registrations by exhibitors providing hands-on activities for children is the one soft spot. The exhibitor of one of the most popular children's exhibits has retired and another significant exhibitor's participation is in doubt. Please let us know if you are aware of any potential exhibitor offering activities for children.

The objective of Vancouver Train Expo is to promote model railroading as a hobby, consistent with the core mission of the NMRA. It is the sole reason I spend my spare time organizing the event. I think it fair to say this is also the motivator for my fellow organizing committee members. We need your help.

Entertaining the public is the most important aspect of this show in terms of its continued existence. After three quiet years, this is the opportunity to sell this hobby. We need to make as much contact as we can. Your active participation can make a real difference. For exhibitors, active participation means interacting with the guests, especially those of you who are exhibitors and vendors. Be an active proponent through personal initiative during the public hours. Smile at people, ask them questions about why they are attending, direct them to other displays. Be more than a supporter. Be an active promoter!

For the rest of us train enthusiasts, active participation means telling people about the event beforehand (we have posters you can hand out, just ask for them) and signing up as a volunteer on event days.

Looking for a train event to attend in May 2024?? Well, look no further!! Registration and Hotel Reservations are now open.

This convention will take place May 22-26, 2024, and be held at the Sheraton Guildford Hotel in Surrey, BC. The convention is called Surrey Excursion.

Hotel guest room rates will start at \$165.00 plus taxes (Canadian dollars) per night. There is a grace period of three days either side of the convention dates to receive the preferred rate for anyone wishing to do some exploring. For those guests staying overnight in the hotel, we have negotiated complimentary parking and WiFi to save you \$25.00 per day. A daily parking fee will be charged for those not staying in the hotel.

All clinics, display/contest, banquet, and non-rail rooms will be located on the second floor of the hotel. There is access to all these rooms by conveniently located elevators.

Access to self-guided layout tours, contests, displays, AP evaluation, clinics, operation sessions, and in house non-rail activities are included in the registration pricing.

There will be optional additional pricing for Modeling with the Masters®, banquet with a guest speaker, as well as a raffle. We are also offering two escorted prototype tours to the G3 Grain Terminal in North Vancouver on Thursday May 23. One will be in the morning and the other in the afternoon.

2023 Railway Modellers' Meet of BC a Success

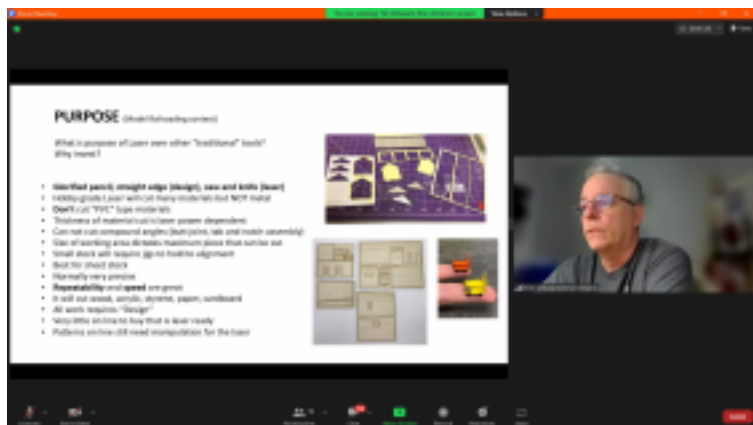
The Railway Modellers' Meet of BC (RMMBC) is the 7th Division's largest modeller-focussed event. It has been held, in one form or another, for at least 35 years.

Last year RMMBC was primarily an online event with a one-day, one room in-person event held at a New Westminster community centre. This year it returned to a full-on in-person meet at its familiar Simon Fraser University (SFU) location. The organizing committee had learned during the pandemic that Zoom-based clinics allowed easy access for 7th Division members living outside of the lower mainland, leading to the inclusion of two evening "virtual prologues" of online clinics in this year's RMMBC.

SFU provides a easily accessed venue in the middle of the Lower Mainland, with food services and inexpensive accomodation. It also provides lecture halls ideal for presenting clinics, with adjacent rooms well suited for displays and other purposes.

The online "virtual prologues" each included four clinics provided over Zoom, while the in-person event at SFU included fourteen clinics in two concurrent streams. The in-person event included a very successful prototype tour of a new grain terminal in North Vancouver, along with two operating sessions held at a number of layouts and a evening layout tour in Surrey and Langley. The in-person meet also included model displays, commercial displays, meet-up sessions and a number of other events and sessions.

Next year RMMBC will take a year off to allow the 7th Division to put on the 2024 PNR Convention, but it will be back in 2025! In the meantime, have a look at the following photos taken during this year's RMMBC.

Railway Heritage Award Presented to Doug Mayer

The Railway Heritage Award is presented annually, when appropriate, to a current member of the 7th Division who has contributed in a meaningful way to the preservation of railway history. To be considered for the award, the nominee shall have performed one or more of the following:

- have been a member of an historical association or society that works on the preservation and presentation of railway history and artifacts
- have contributed to the preservation of railway history through published writings or through volunteer work on restoration projects
- have exhibited a substantial interest in the history of railways in British Columbia and its preservation; or contributed many hours volunteering with an operating heritage railway
- have participated substantially in some other significant way to preserve railway heritage

A candidate for this award is nominated by his or her peers, and the chosen recipient must be recommended by the award co-ordinator and approved by the 7th Division Board of Directors.

This year's recipient, Doug Mayer, has been associated with the Revelstoke Railway Museum for over 30 years. He is the author of six books on the Canadian Pacific Railway's Revelstoke Division and has researched far and wide to collect the data for these books. The books are available through the Revelstoke Railway Museum's website and all proceeds go to the museum. Doug has also been an active member of the group of modellers that have built a model railroad in the museum to show visitors some of the highlights of the Division. Last but not least he has been very active in the storage and sorting of the Ferrier Collection of CPR drawings that were donated to the 7th Division and are now being held by the Revelstoke Railway Museum. (Note: when the drawings are completely sorted and catalogued they will be sent to the Canadian Pacific Historical Association to be scanned and returned to the museum for safe storage. The scans will be available online for members of the 7th Division to access.)

It was my pleasure to present Doug with this year's award.

Victoria Model Railway Club Public Display

Some of you are familiar with the very large modular model railway layout of the Victoria Model Railway Club. In its largest form it is about 32' x 60'. When not set up at a public model train show it lives in a 24' utility trailer parked in a member's yard. We would love a permanent home where the layout could be set up between shows and used by the members but such a facility has been elusive. We have had temporary homes in the past but not for several years.

Earlier this year one of our new members took up the search by approaching several shopping centres with empty stores to see if we could use one in exchange for opening to the public two or three times a week. The new owners of Tillicum Centre in Saanich were receptive as we had set up the layout there during Spring Break in March 2022. We opened to the public on June 9 this year and were open every Friday evening and Saturday and Sunday afternoon through to Labour Day. We took the next three weeks of our tenancy to do some much needed repairs and upgrades before moving the layout to Sidney for the annual Victoria Model Train Show. Over the remaining months of 2023 Tillicum Centre will play host to a number of events which pay to use the space we were given for free.

Our display at Tillicum Centre has been a great success. The public found the display very interesting and educational. It drew people in that didn't normally patronize the mall and the other merchants noticed the increase in customer traffic. In addition to the layout and its trains we hung railway-related art and memorabilia in the show window and on the walls. We also invited displays from the likes of Craigdarroch Castle and the Royal BC Museum. We garnered several new members from our time at the mall as we did in 2022.

We will continue to look for a long term home but the short term stay at Tillicum Centre was a rewarding experience and we encourage other model railway clubs to pursue a similar arrangement in their region. There is a possibility of going back to Tillicum Centre in the new year which we would welcome. The down side of free space in a shopping mall is that we will have to move out when a paying tenant is found, but until then we get to promote the hobby and play with our trains!

Obituary

William (Bill) Ackland, MMR #149

Prepared from an obituary by Bill's family

Bill was born in Brockville, Ontario, on November 26, 1937. He grew up swimming, skating, and boating on the St. Lawrence River. As a young man, he was a proud member of Scouts Canada. In his teenage years he enjoyed driving cars and motorcycles. Bill's father, Edgar, introduced him to model railroading at an early age and he developed a passion for trains that became the primary focus of his life.

In 1966 he moved to Waterloo to attend the University of Waterloo Electrical Engineering program. He designed several electric motors, for which Electrohome, his employer, was awarded patents. In 1969 Bill started his first HO scale model railway layout. Gathering other people who had an interest in the hobby, he formed the Doubleheader's Model Railway Club and sat on the board for many years. Much gratitude goes to the Doubleheader's members who continue to support his legacy, promote the hobby, and coordinate an annual layout tour for people to enjoy.

Bill built a custom home in Puslinch, Ontario, in 1975. There he expanded his layout, completed the scenery, built the structures, painted the people, and hosted weekly operating sessions. This layout became widely known as the STR Railroad. Bill was thrilled to host the STR operators every Monday night and was always interested in helping other people build their layouts. After working hard to meet the requirements, Bill achieved the honour of Master Model Railroader (MMR) from the National Model Railroad Association (NMRA).

In 2008, at the age of 70, Bill made the decision to move to Victoria, BC, where he established a new life with his partner Barbara Mellet. They had many adventures travelling around and exploring the province. In his spare time, Bill started to build N scale trains and structures based on the Kaslo and Slocan Railway.

Due to health issues, Bill returned to Ontario in 2019 to be near his daughter in Guelph. During his period of declining health, he enjoyed having many of his trains and handmade railroad structures around him.

On February 15, 2023, Bill peacefully boarded the train for his final destination. He is fondly remembered by all the people he connected with through railway modelling.
