With great sadness, I must announce the passing of three of our members:

Brian Pate, February 11, 1928 – August 28, 2023

Brian was a member of the Nor-West Model Railway Club and the NMRA, and co-founder of VanRail. He mentored and inspired many model railway enthusiasts over the years. Brian received some of the top awards in the NMRA for his model-building skills. He donated a model of Dredge No.4 and the KMR railway layout to Parks Canada in Dawson City, Yukon, and a model of Arrowhead docks and surroundings to the museum in Revelstoke, BC.

Richard (Dick) Sutcliffe, November 12, 1935 – September 24th, 2023

Dick Sutcliffe was a Superintendent and one of the pillars of the 7th Division, the PNR, and the entire model railroading community. A Celebration of Life for Dick will be held at the Burnaby Central Railway's station meeting room on Sunday, November 19th, between 1:30 and 4:00 PM.

Jay Golightly, 1943 – August 21st, 2023

Jay was a member of the Vancouver Model Railway Club on the fifth floor of the then Canadian National Station, and collaborated on a number of projects and memorable events including train shows and TrainGang activities.

Vancouver Train Expo Update

It's here, or over. Depending on when you read this.

Depending on when you read this update, Vancouver Train Expo November 3rd and 4th will, or will very soon, be open; or you missed it.

As I write this update the event is less than two weeks away. Most of the pieces are in place:

- venue contract signed; and the full venue rental paid
- furnishings supplier contract signed and advance paid
- electrical contractor advance paid
- vendors and exhibitors registered
- liability insurance acquired
- floor plan completed
- the marketing campaign is well underway
- the search for setup and event day volunteers continues
- a long list of last minute tasks await attention.

The venue is pretty much full with the Marketplace sold out and couple of booth spaces left. A number of large exhibitors have dropped out. Fortunately, there have been a few new exhibits to replace them.

Within the traditional exhibits there is a trend towards smaller displays. The number of small exhibits has shrunk. The demand for booth space has declined, while the demand for Marketplace sales tables is up significantly (35 percent) with tables added to meet the demand.

West Coast Railway Association will not be running the mini-rail riding train this year. Fortunately, the British Columbia Society of Model Engineers is working to provide a replacement. A special thanks to Gordon Hall for his work in coordinating the mini-rail replacement and the Fraser Valley Autism children's play track.

There are indications that the marketing campaign is going well.

As in my previous update, entertaining the public is a very important aspect of this show in terms of its continued existence. After three quiet years, this is the opportunity to sell this hobby. We need to make as much contact as we can. Your active participation can make a real difference. For exhibitors, active participation means interacting with the guests, especially those of you who are exhibitors and vendors. Be an active proponent through personal initiative during the public hours. Smile at people, ask them questions about why they are attending, direct them to other displays. Be more than a supporter. Be an active promoter of the hobby!

Thanks to you for supporting the hobby! Look forward to seeing you in November! I hope to be able to report on a very successful event in my next update.

Registration and Hotel Reservations are now open!

The **Surrey Excursion** Convention will take place **May 22-26, 2024**, and be held at the Sheraton Guildford Hotel in Surrey, BC.

Hotel guest room rates start at \$165.00 plus taxes (Canadian dollars) per night. There is a grace period of 3 days on either side of the convention dates to receive the preferred rate for anyone wishing to do some exploring. For those guests staying overnight in the hotel, we have negotiated complimentary parking and wi-fi to save you \$25.00 per day. An on-site daily parking fee will be charged for those not staying in the hotel.

All clinics, display/contest, banquet, and non-rail rooms will be located on the 2nd floor of the hotel. There is access to all these rooms by conveniently located elevators to assist with helping to find the locations for all the events.

Access to self-guided layout tours, contests, displays, AP evaluation, clinics, operation sessions, and in house non-rail activities are included in the registration pricing.

As of this writing, we have arranged 13 clinics covering several topic areas. There will be many more to come as we have 52 clinic slots to offer.

We have also arranged for Non-Rail guest activities such as quilt and placemat making for charity, movie night, games, puzzles, colouring, and outings. So, plan to bring your significant other to Surrey as well.

There will be optional additional pricing for Modelling with the Masters® and the banquet with a guest speaker, as well as raffles and door prizes. We are also offering two escorted prototype tours to the G3 Grain Terminal in North Vancouver on Thursday May 23. One will be in the morning and the other in the afternoon.

Awards

John Martin Receives Ross Heriot Memorial Golden Spike Award

This award was first presented in 1968, and is usually presented annually to one or more individuals in the PNR 7th Division who have made a significant contribution to the division and its membership. It is in appreciation of their unselfish devotion of time and effort to further the aims of the NMRA, the PNR, and the hobby of railway modelling through assistance and service for the benefit of all railway modellers within the division.

In a recent issue of the Bulletin Board, I shared a remembrance about Ross written by his friend the late Spike Brown:

My collection of nominees is running out and I am sure that there are many individuals who have assisted their fellow members over many years but are not known to me... So I would encourage you think of those who have served faithfully, and send me a letter or e-mail recognizing their achievements, contributions, and involvement in activities that support the objectives and members of the 7th Division.

I thank those who supplied nominations for this year's award. I have gratefully received letters supporting this year's recipient.

This year's recipient has been an active member of the division for over eight years. Among his many contributions to the 7th Division, some particular highlights come to mind:

This year's recipient stepped up to serve as the 7th Division Superintendent in 2016 on the retirement of Russ Watson. From then until his retirement from the Superintendent's position in November 2021 and his subsequent assumption of, and retirement from, the Assistant Superintendent's position in late 2022 he accomplished much. Acting as a gentle elder statesman and motivator he has served the 7th Division actively and very well.

He was instrumental in transitioning the 7th Division's annual meet from its traditional format as a combined public train show and modellers' meet to the current format as the Railway Modellers Meet of British Columbia, an event dedicated to modelling, and the Vancouver Train Expo, a public train show. Both events have benefited from this reorganization and are better than they previously were. The transition required the creation of a separate legal entity, Lower Mainland Train Expo Society, and the sorting out of the financial relationship between the 7th Division and the new Society, to which John played a key role. John served actively on the Vancouver Train Expo Organizing Committee and the RMMBC committee as the liaison between the two organizations and the division. He continues to play an important role providing guidance to the Organizing Committee.

In his letter of nomination Tom Lundgren wrote: "As the Leader of Vancouver Train Expo I wish to express my great appreciation for John's interest and active assistance in support of the public train show."

John's contributions are clearly consistent with the criteria for the Golden Spike Award.

I do hope you will all join me in thanking and acknowledging our past superintendent John Martin as the 2023 recipient of the Ross Heriot Memorial Golden Spike award.

Obituary

Brian Pate

Prominent North Vancouver railway modeller and 7th Division member Brian David Pate died peacefully on August 28, 2023 at the age of 95. Brian was predeceased by his beloved wife, Margaret, and leaves behind five children, ten grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

Brian was born on February 11, 1928 in north-east London, England. He studied chemistry at London University, earning a Bachelor's degree in 1949 and a Master's degree in 1951. In 1953, Brian and Margaret moved to Montreal, where Brian completed a PhD in Chemistry at McGill University in 1955. Three years later, Brian moved the family to the United States, where he did post-doctoral research at Brookhaven National Laboratory in New York and then worked as an associate professor at the University of Washington in St. Louis, Missouri. In 1965, the family of seven moved to North Vancouver, where Brian joined SFU as professor and founding head of the chemistry department. He went on to become the Associate Director of TRIUMF at UBC, and was the Director of the UBC program on Positron Emission Tomography (PET). His interests included nuclear chemistry, radiochemistry, analytical chemistry and the application of PET in brain research.

Brian was a long-time railway modeller, and was a mentor and inspiration to many model railway enthusiasts. He was a member of the Nor-West Model Railway club and co-founder of the VanRail operations meet. His modelling skills won some of the top awards in the NMRA, including two Gold Awards for Best in Show at NMRA National Conventions for his models of CNR's Canora steamship and Klondike Mining Company's Dredge #4. He built many layouts, culminating in his HOn3 model of the Klondike Mines Railway (KMR), with a somewhat idiosyncratic added connection to Revelstoke and Arrowhead. When it came time to move out of his home Brian donated the model of Dredge #4 and the KMR layout to Parks Canada for display in Dawson City, Yukon, and the model of the Arrowhead docks and surroundings to the Revelstoke Railway Museum.

In addition to railway modelling, Brian enjoyed numerous activities including sailing, hiking, camping, gardening and travelling. Brian and Margaret, who were married for 69 years, made visiting their family a priority. Brian was a life-long learner, learning Italian and how to play bridge in his later years. He was passionate about science and enjoyed intellectual conversations. Brian was wise, caring and generous, and maintained his sense of humour until the end.

Obituary

Richard (Dick) Sutcliffe

Richard Arthur Sutcliffe, or Dick as he was to become commonly known, was born in Vancouver on 12 November 1935. He grew up in a house on Pender street opposite the PNE that had an unusual feature: its basement was completely filled with a large, outside-third-rail, O gauge layout. This was built by Art Sutcliffe, Dick's father and a prominent Vancouver railway modeller. Dick once told me that he grew up thinking everyone had such a layout in their basement. There is little wonder why trains ended up being such a big part of Dick's life.

Dick's first serious venture into railway modelling occurred in his teens and resulted in an HO layout that could be lowered from the ceiling into the small laundry area that was the only part of the basement free from the large O gauge layout. Progress on the layout slowed as Dick got out into the world, but enthusiasm for trains would return later.

In his twenties, Dick and one of his sisters decided to travel to Australia as the start of a trip around the world. Both ended up working there, found romantic partners, got married and returned to Canada to raise families, with three children in Dick's case. Dick started working as a shop teacher for the Maple Ridge school district until he retired about twenty-five years ago.

After returning to Canada, Dick turned his efforts to a broad selection of railway modelling activities. He built a number of layouts, including a large HO scale layout in his home, in addition to a number of N and HO scale modules. He also built and scratchbuilt a large number of models including steam locomotives. He was involved closely with the Dewdney-Alouette Railway Society in Maple Ridge, as well as the BC Society of Model Engineers and several other organisations. He contributed heavily to all these groups.

Dick was deeply involved in NMRA-related activities. He spent several years as Superintendent of the 7th Division and held other positions with the 7th Division, PNR and other railway modelling organisations. He was in charge of 7th Division publicity almost until he died (he always added the word "still" whenever he mentioned this). He was awarded the Ross Heriot Memorial Golden Spike Award in 1990, as well as the PNR Person of the Year award in 2000.

Dick died 24 September 2023 after a brief illness. He will be greatly missed in the 7th Division and in the broader railway modelling community. A memorial for Dick will be held Sunday, November 19th, between 1:30 and 4:00 PM at the Burnaby Central Railway's station meeting room at the north end of Willingdon Street in Burnaby. All who knew Dick are welcome.

Obituary

Jay Golightly – 1943-2023

I regret to advise that we have lost a good friend whom I have had the privilege of knowing for over fifty years. I first met Jay in the early 1970s at the Vancouver HO Model Railway Club on the fifth floor of the then Canadian National Station. In the following years we met and collaborated over a number of projects and memorable events including the annual train shows and TraiNgang activities.

He was a regular attendee at a small group of model railway friends who used to gather at my home on Friday evenings beginning in the 1990's. He was an amazing painter and detailer of model railway locomotives and equipment in both HO and N scale. He delighted in creating unlikely models of fictitious railway equipment for the simple purpose of aggravating those detail-oriented modellers known as "rivet counters".

He was also an active member of the TraiNgang and edited their newsletter for several years and participated in setup at many public shows and of course the TRAINS meets.

Professionally Jay was a boomer who over many years worked for a variety of railways and bus companies including TransLink as a Skytrain attendant. When not working on trains, Jay drove over a million accident-free miles on highway coaches. Jay was a proud member of Mensa, an avid photographer, a punster, and a good friend to many in his multi-faceted life.

In late August I was shocked and saddened to receive the following message from his wife Sandy in Saskatchewan:

I'm saddened to write to you that J passed away suddenly from a heart attack on Monday night, August 21st. I tentatively hope to have a memorial service for him in Vancouver sometime down the road. I will let you know as that develops. In the meantime, would you let his other friends in the model railroad community know, please.

There is a secular celebration of life planned for Jay on the afternoon of Saturday, 18th November 2023 beginning at 3:00PM in the lower hall of St Thomas Anglican Church located at 2444 East 41st Ave, Vancouver. (Please note that parking is NOT permitted on either side of East 41st Ave between Victoria Drive and Kingsway.)
