## Quesnel Model Railway Club

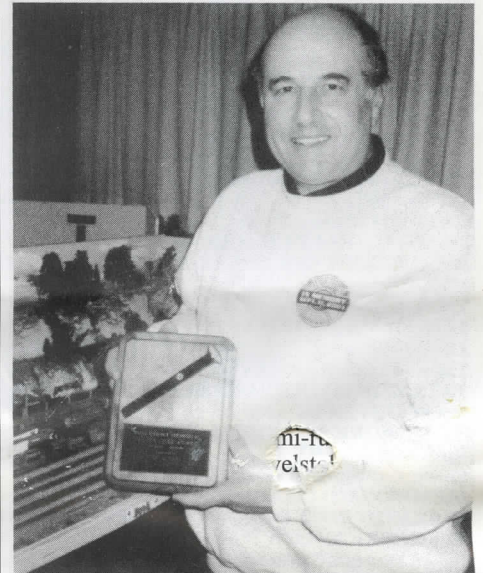
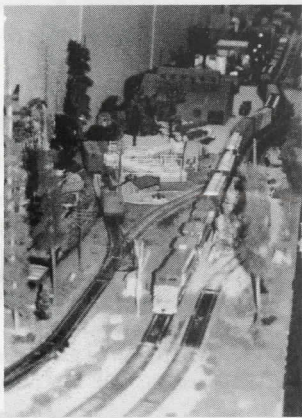

The Quesnel Model Railway Club started in 1995 with six people planning to build a modular HO scale layout. One of our members with space in his building convinced us to build a permanent club layout in a 18 X 24' room, with adjoining small rooms he had available. We built a small 3 X 6' layout which we put in the front window of a local store that Christmas to advertise our existence. We had all of the track laid, most of the wiring done, and the scenery one-half done on the club layout when that member lost interest and we lost our space. We were then a club of three, meeting at each other's homes for approximately the next two years.

We decided to build a few modules with the idea of setting up a display at Christmas in one of the malls. In September 2000, we moved into an empty store in West Park Mall in Quesnel. The modules we had built gave us an opportunity to have something running for December. We regained a previous member and acquired a Lionel collector for cross-training. We had our first public opening on December 2, 2000. The club owned four corner, one regular and two two-foot connector modules with the members owning another seven modules. This year we have added another four modules that unfortunately have filled the available space. We have almost completed the wiring for the staging yards and connecting tracks and have added much detail and lights to the various modules.

We have learned from experience that people really love the details, especially the ones that represent the local flavour such as Roy's homemade lumber loads with wrappers from most of Quesnel's sawmills and plywood plant. Simply adding a local sign to a standard Walther's building has a positive effect. We love the comments from people asking, "where did it come from and who made it." Many ask where we get all of our supplies from and we tell them to see Hal (Kinsey) who has been most helpful.

We lost one of our founding members, John Davis, to a heart attack in August. We have gained two members who didn't know that there were any other modellers out there until they saw our layout in the mall. If you are in town, please give us a call and we'll do our best to arrange a visit to the layout. Several recent examples come to mind; in the last BB I mentioned the idea of resuming the 7D semi-monthly Clinic program and asked for 'thoughts' on the idea. To date I have received no feedback. ## AP CORNER

### #12 - CHIEF DISPATCHER

The last Achievement Certificate in the broad category of Construction and Operation is Chief Dispatcher. This category is the study and practice of prototypical operation on the model railroad. As always, with a little planning, this is an "easy attainment" certificate. Having fulfilled the criteria, you will not only be conversant with prototypical operation, but also have a good understanding of how these principles apply to any operation-oriented layout and perhaps even have some suggestions for upgrading the track plan!

To qualify you must:

A. Participate in the operation of a model railroad(s) for a minimum of 50 hours. A minimum of 10 hours each must be served in three of the five categories below, one of which must be #5 Chief Dispatcher.

1. Engineer (mainline, passenger, or way freight)
2. Yardmaster (or station master) make-up and break-down trains, freight or passenger
3. Hostler (or power desk) manage engine facilities and/or assign motive power.
4. Traffic Manager (road master or tower man) assign routes and industry traffic; keeps road traffic moving smoothly
5. Chief Dispatcher - coordinate all train movements detailed either by sequence, timetable and fast clock, or other operating system

B. Document

1. Prepare a schematic drawing of the layout indicating all simulated distances
2. Develop a timetable of operation of this layout covering a minimum of 8 hours
3. Construct an operation graph detailing the schedule (2 above) for timetable operation of this model railroad
4. Develop, or adapt from an existing system, a system of operation of the layout including all necessary movement forms with an explanation of their use in controlling car movements, train make-up and prototypical operation.

Anyone who helps operate a home or club layout can achieve these criteria.

### TREATMENT FOR DECALLING

- After the model has been painted the desired color, cover with a coat of glaze. Allow to dry thoroughly and apply decals. Wash off any decal glue. When dry give a coat of Dullcote to hide the decal sheen. (Decals do not adhere well to a matte surface.)

NOTE - Dullcote in a spray bomb delivers a high volume. Use sparingly. Both Testors Dullcote and Glosscote come in bottles as do Floquil Flat Finish and Glaze, for use in an air brush.

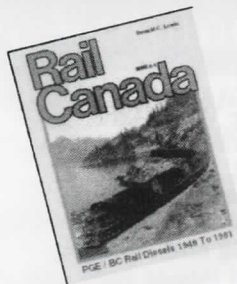

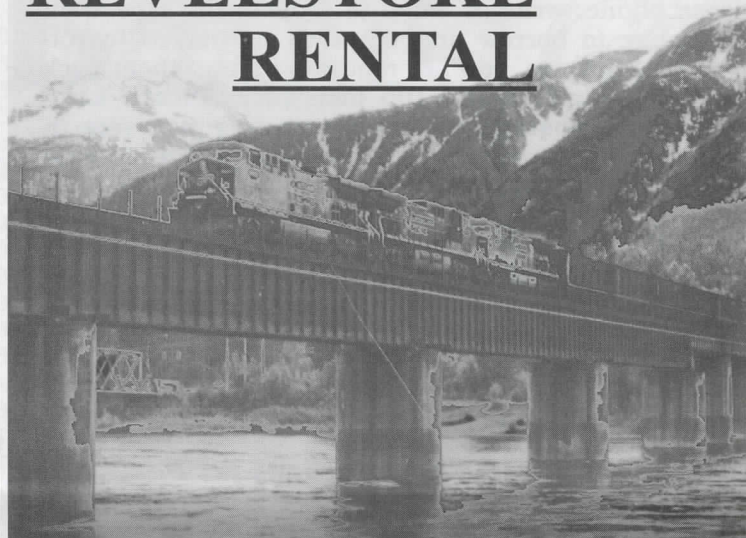
